

- STEP 1: Print your chosen Beebe pumpkin stencil and trim off the excess paper around the design. If you are painting your design, cut out the black parts of the design.
- STEP 2: Next, pin or tape the stencil to your pumpkin.
- STEP 3: Using a push pin, pumpkin poker, or marker, make small dots to trace around the black areas of your design—these will be the areas you cut out or paint in.
- STEP 4: Once you've traced your design, remove your stencil and get to carving or painting!


